

# The Spirit of the Wild Rice Conference Glenn Dorr Scholarship



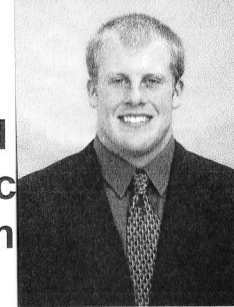
The Spirit of the Wild Rice Conference Scholarship was established in memory of Glenn Dorr who passed away from cancer July 28, 2003.

Glenn spent his entire life doing for his students and friends. Glenn touched the lives of virtually everyone in the Wild Rice Conference during his 20 years as principal at Milnor High School. Over the years, he served as athletic director, teacher, coach, and even drove the bus when a driver was needed. Glenn played a fundamental roll in getting the Milnor Track Complex built, donating many hours of volunteer labor. In 1988 Glenn was recognized as district, regional, and state athletic director of the year. If Glenn was not coaching or driving bus, he attended nearly every sporting event. Glenn was an exceptional man who left a legacy few of us could ever match.

Joe (VCSU student)

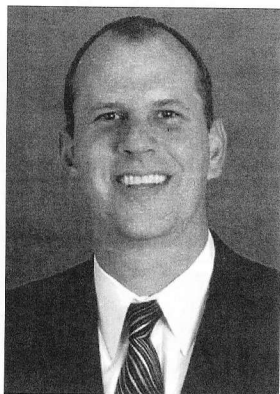
Sandy's hobbies include reading, photography and computers.

Head Men's Basketball Coach

The 22nd head coach in the Wolves history, Paul Sather begins his second year at the helm of the Wolves.

A 1996 graduate of Northern State, Sather makes his return to familiar sidelines, having spent time as an assistant coach under both Bob Olson and Meyer from 1998-2004. Sather has spent the past five years as the head coach at Black Hills State, guiding the Yellow Jackets to a 94-62 record during his time there.

Sather was instrumental in turning the BHSU program around from a 10-19 season in 2006-07 to an NAIA Final Four contender in 2008-09. The Yellow Jackets also qualified for the national tournament in 2009-10 and compiled an overall conference record of 46-25 in the five years under Sather, winning two Dakota Athletic Conference championships.

Sather resides in Aberdeen with his wife Kelsie and their two children, Sam (7) and Becca (3).
